# ILLINOIS LIBRARY SHOVEL-READY CONSTRUCTION/ RENOVATION PROJECTS

**February 9, 2009**

The Illinois Library Association (ILA) has compiled the following information about Illinois library construction and renovation projects. If federal economic stimulus funds are available or if funds are available from the State of Illinois for capital projects, the following projects briefly describe library construction/renovation needs across the state. More information is available, for example, complete contact information, the project's readiness level, and more complete descriptions of the project.

ILA sent this information to our federal officials (Illinois Senators and Representatives in the U.S. Congress) and to state officials (Illinois Governor Pat Quinn, Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White, and Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Director Jack Lavin) for consideration. This list is also available on the ILA Web site at [www.ila.org/construction](http://www.ila.org/construction).

While the association realizes the country's economic situation and the legislative environment is certainly unique – and extremely fluid – it is the association's intention to revise this list on a periodic basis.
