In a recent presentation, marketing expert Seth Godin, claimed to not care about the future because there was so much incredible change happening right now. If academic librarians fail to adapt quickly to the changing expectations of the current Connected Age, their future may be bleak. Adaptive change requires staff flexibility and an organizational culture that facilitates innovation, but these qualities remain elusive for many academic libraries. The essence of design is creating thoughtful change and promoting workplace innovation. How might we utilize the design approach to accelerate change for inspiring innovation in our organizations in order to give our user community members a better library experience? In this keynote talk, Steven Bell will explore how academic librarians can put the design approach, a process that designers use to identify problems and develop thoughtful solutions, to work in their libraries to accelerate ideation, innovation and implementation in times of constant change and challenge.
