



2025 Mission Statement




Mission Statement for iREAD 2026: Plant a Seed, Read



Theme for 2027: SCIENCE FICTION









Vision statement:

Lend itself to strong graphic interpretation Have appeal to preK-8 students, YA, adults, and library staff
