The Advocacy Committee focuses on implementation of the legislative agenda as recommended by the Public Policy Committee (PPC) and approved by the ILA Executive Board; develops an annual advocacy plan in conjunction with PPC and the Executive Board; identifies advocacy best practices and implements them as appropriate; builds partnerships with organizations that have similar views; is responsible for advocacy education of ILA members; develops educational materials and programs to improve ILA members' advocacy skills.

We wish to change the charge to the following:

The ILA Advocacy committee:

- Supports the targeted advocacy efforts set forth by ALA and ILA
- Works to unite ILA members behind advocacy goals/priorities as set forth by ILA/PPC
- Provides ILA membership with the tools to help make advocacy a more natural, comfortable activity on the local and state levels.
- Works with the ILA President and ILA Executive Director to set a detailed calendar (July-June) of advocacy activities and creates materials to support those activities

We feel the new charge more clearly defines the relationship the Advocacy Committee has with the PPC and the Executive board. The charge also sets a focus on local advocacy as well as state efforts. And the new charge gives future Committee members some general guidance they will need to ensure ongoing success and consistency.
