

## Our Problem

We believe the biggest strength of a library is the staff and a happy staff that works well together makes our library and our community stronger.

Prior to COVID, we held many in-person events every month. From monthly meet-ups for continuing education and two all day in-service events to staff-giving and parties for retirements, weddings, babies our staff regularly engaged with each other in addition to their daily work.

Just like everything else, our staff engagement was turned upside down due to COVID. Our problem became: How do you throw a retirement luncheon for 60 people when it is unsafe to be in a room together? How do you make staff feel like a team when they go from sharing a physical desk to never being in the building at the same time? How can you make work fun when everyone is dealing with the effects of a pandemic on their personal and professional lives?

The following presentation shows the creative and unique ways we answered these questions and continue to engage staff members while keeping everyone safe.

#### Membership

When staff returned to work in early June, it became apparent that staff engagement was going to be an issue. Many people still worked part or most of their workday from home and those in the building were socially distanced. Days of yapping around the water cooler or coffee pot were over.

The Funshine committee is a longstanding, social committee at APL but membership was at zero. Only one staff person volunteered. Luckily, through the use of begging and bribery, one more staff person was enticed to join and the committee was up and running. But they could not do it alone. To increase membership they:

- Asked everyone we knew to join
- Assured people it would only be for 6 months
- Used a lot of humor in our recruitment

No one else joined – BUT – we did get several people who "could not emotionally commit to the committee" offer to help with activities





## Branding

Branding became a big issue for the committee. Since day-to-day, in person interaction among staff was not possible the committee needed to find a way to promote Funshine activities that was easily recognizable.

Working with the library's Communications and Marketing Coordinator we developed a new branding standard and commandeered a centrally located bulletin board to promote events, news, and other fun activities.

We used this logo in all our communication to staff to help identify news from the committee.





#### **Bulletin Board**

The committees' main physical form of communication became the bulletin board.

- The bulletin board includes:
- News –
   includes Funshine announcements,
   staff news
- Just for fun Poll results from silly staff polls sent out n a regular basis using Crowdpurr, a software we already use for a patron trivia program.
- Staff anniversaries —
   Staff anniversaries for the previous six months. Normally, staff anniversaries are posted monthly.

The committee decided to post all the months missed due to COVID. The staff LOVED this and really helped people remember an reconnect with each other.





#### Jar of Wishes

As passing around a card is no longer safe and we wanted a way for staff to safely pass on their best wishes we have been using a Jar of Wishes in place of a card.

Each person fills out a die-cut shape and writes a note, these notes are placed in the jar and quarantined for 7 days and then the entire jar is given to the staff member.

Note: cost of jar was same as the cost of an average retirement card.

The committee's first task was, "Oh by the way, Jane is retiring and needs to be offered a retirement luncheon. You cannot have buffet style and must socially distance. Good luck!"

Undaunted, we brainstormed several ideas.

- Use the large multi-purpose room and socially distance everyone in shifts. (Not practical and concerned that not everyone would be comfortable with this scenario.)
- Have luncheon outside at village picnic tables (Logistics of moving tables and weather was too big of a concern.)
- Use the board room, let Jane invite 3-4 closest coworkers to socially distance with doors and windows opened) and have everyone else Zoom into the luncheon)





- The luncheon was announced to staff via the bulletin board, email and the Intranet.
- A menu of items, with ingredient lists were posted so staff could simply grab and go their choice of lunch.
- We had staff members monitoring the breakroom and lunch pick up to ensure no gathering and safe meal pick up.

- Single serve, wrapped items
- Made available in the morning, so staff could pick up on breaks
- A total surprise, announced the day before
- Staff LOVED this and keep asking
  - "What's next for the staff treat?"
  - "Can we have ice cream every Tuesday?!"
- Up next: Snack cakes & salty snacks




## **Future Plans**

## Points to Remember and to Promote your own Funshine Fun

- You don't have to spend a lot of money to engage and celebrate your staff!
  - Ice cream for 70+ people was about \$30 from the grocery store
  - A bulletin board was repurposed, and our polls are done on an existing library platform
  - Cut outs for message in a bottle are done using cardstock and the library's die cut machine
- No need to reinvent the wheel, what has your staff always loved and how do you make that safe?
  - Retirement lunches were a standard for us, so we retooled it to box lunches and zoom. Everyone ate and talked, just in a new way
- If something works, do it again!
  - Our first message in a bottle worked, so we continued to use the same system. Just like a card, doing it more than once does not make it any less special as long it is personalized to the recipient.
- You can't go wrong with a fun surprise for no reason.
  - Don't forget to have something so everyone to participate—vegetarian, dairy free, chocolate and non-chocolate, etc.
- Brand your activities
  - •Let employees know you exist and more fun is coming!
