Activities underway or completed since the last report:

Spark – Trial by Fire: Lesson Learned from a Pandemic was held on December 9, 2021.

In December, the IACRL membership accepted the revised by-laws.

During the March 2021, the IACRL executive board formally added the Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion Committee to its roster.

IACRL held its second town hall this year. IACRL Spring COVID-19 Town Hall One Year Later focused on what our libraries are doing to adapt physical spaces and online library instruction and services. Five panelists from several academic libraries presented on strategies they have employed, which was followed by participant conversation.

Journal Club continues to meet bi-annually. On February 18, 2021, Laura Barnes led a discussion on 'If you aren't White, Asian or Indian, you aren't an engineer": racial microaggressions in STEM education." She also created a list of additional resources to share with the membership via the IACRL webpage.

In December 2020, over 60 librarians came together to view and discuss the ACRL webinar "Teaching Online in Plain Language."
