Illinois Association of College and Research Libraries (IACRL)

Annual Report: July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025

The Illinois Association of College and Research Libraries (IACRL) continued to provide programs, initiatives, and leadership opportunities to support academic librarians in Illinois. The year emphasized virtual engagement and professional development, while also laying the groundwork for future in-person events.

The Conference and Continuing Education Committee (C&CE) organized multiple programs to foster learning and networking. In November 2024, the committee hosted a panel discussion on the topic of mentorship. In April 2025, it presented the Spring Sampler, a mini virtual conference featuring lightning talks and panel discussions from institutions such as UIUC, CARLI, and NIU. These events provided valuable professional development opportunities and highlighted best practices for online engagement.

The Communications Committee produced both the fall 2024 and spring 2025 newsletters, promoting IACRL programs and ensuring ongoing visibility of the forum's initiatives. Social media and newsletter outreach also supported conference programming and public statements on issues impacting academic librarianship.

IACRL maintained a prominent presence at the ILA Annual Conference, including the IACRL Luncheon and the Unconference. The luncheon featured speaker April Anderson-Zorn, who addressed topics such as impostor phenomenon and access to historical information on underrepresented populations. The Unconference continued to provide a platform for networking and discussing pressing issues within the academic library community.

The Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Committee planned future programming, including panels on reparative cataloging and inclusive practices. The committee collaborated with other ILA groups and RAILS to broaden outreach and resources.

The Awards Committee recognized excellence across multiple areas. The People's Choice Award was presented to three outstanding publications:
