General Operating Grants

Illinois Humanities will provide emergency relief general operating support for humanities-based nonprofit organizations with budgets of up to \$2 million.

There are two funding pools: one designated for organizations based within Cook County and one designated for organizations based outside Cook County.

These grants are specifically for humanities-based nonprofits, which includes:

- cultural and ethnic organizations;
- history organizations;
- humanities museums;
- literature organizations;
- humanities education organizations;
- media, journalism, and documentary organizations;
- libraries and archives; and
- consortiums, alliances, and collectives of these groups.

Gen Ops | Guidelines

- Grants will range from \$5,000 to \$10,000 (depending on organizational budget size). No matching funds are required.
- Please use the location-specific application. Choose the location based on whether your organization is located within (or outside of) Cook County, regardless of where programming takes place. Illinois Humanities is committed to geographic diversity and equitably serving the entire state.
- These grants are general operating, or unrestricted, in nature. This means that organizations can use the funds for organizational expenditures as leadership sees fit (as opposed to project-specific grants). However, since these are federal funds, there are restrictions on how organizations can use general operating support; for example, organizations cannot use these funds for alcohol, lobbying, or international travel. A full list of restrictions will be included in the grant award agreement.

Gen Ops | Eligibility

- These general operating, or unrestricted, grants are available to tax-exempt humanities-based organizations located in Illinois with an expressed and demonstrated commitment to the public humanities.
- Tax-exempt organizations with annual budgets of \$2 million or less. Groups with a fiscal sponsor or agent can also apply.
- As required by the National Endowment for the Humanities, organizations must have a Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number in order to receive funding. A DUNS number is not required to apply, however, funds cannot be awarded to organizations not registered. If you do not have a DUNS number, please [register for one here](#). There is no cost to register. Please note that it can take up to two weeks to receive a DUNS number.
- The following types of organizations are **ineligible** for general operating support: organizations that do not have an explicit commitment to the humanities in their mission and programming; K-12 schools; universities, colleges, and academic departments; chapters of national organizations; for-profit organizations; religious organizations; and individuals.

Humanities Project Grants

Illinois Humanities will provide support for emergency relief and recovery to Illinois-based nonprofits to develop or continue humanities-based projects in 2021.

These grants will support organizations that may not have an explicit humanities-based mission or scope but incorporate humanities-based programs or projects as part of their work. Examples include performing arts groups that include audience-based discussions of the work; park districts that host seminars or workshops on history, literature, or other humanities disciplines; visual arts groups or art museums that incorporate art history discussions or seminars; community-based organizations that host discussions with community members that promote civic engagement; etc.

There are two funding pools: one designated for organizations based within Cook County and one designated for organizations based outside Cook County.

Project Grants | Guidelines

- The Humanities Project Grants will be for \$5,000.
- These grants are project grants, meant to provide support to tax-exempt organizations intent on carrying out humanities-based projects that aim to help strengthen their community's recovery and resilience during COVID-19. No matching funds are required.
- Please use the location-specific application. Choose the location based on whether your organization is based within (or outside of) Cook County, regardless of where programming takes place. Illinois Humanities is committed to geographic diversity and equitably serving the entire state.

Project Grants | Eligibility

- These project grants are eligible to the following types of organizations: Tax-exempt organizations in Illinois; public libraries; K-12 schools; universities, colleges, and academic departments; and organizations focused on the arts.
- For-profit organizations and individuals are ineligible.
- As required by the National Endowment for the Humanities, organizations must have a Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number in order to receive funding. A DUNS number is not required to apply, however, funds cannot be awarded to organizations not registered. If you do not have a DUNS number, please register for one here. There is no cost to register. Please note that it can take up to two weeks to receive a DUNS number.






