

#### WHAT IS MEDIA LITERACY?

• In 2021, the Illinois legislature passed HB0234 which includes requirements for instructions on media literacy starting in the 2022-2023 school year. <a href="https://doi.org/10.1051/25.27-20.08">105 ILCS 5/27-20.08</a> describes media literacy as "the ability to access, analyze, evaluate, create, and communicate using a variety of objective forms, including, but not limited to, print, visual, audio, interactive, and digital texts." (Illinois General Assembly, 2021)

#### ANALYZING AND EVALUATING MEDIA CONTENT

Social media increases the speed at which untrustworthy content spreads.

There are several ways to learn to analyze media, but here are 5 Key Questions from The Center for Media Literacy: (CML, 2022)

- Who created this message?
- What techniques are used to get my attention?
- How might other people understand this message differently?
- What values or lifestyles are represented or omitted from this message?
- Why is this message being sent?

## HOW TO SPOT FAKE NEWS



#### **CONSIDER THE SOURCE**

Click away from the story to investigate the site, its mission and its contact info.



#### CHECK THE AUTHOR

Do a quick search on the author. Are they credible? Are they real?



#### CHECK THE DATE

Reposting old news stories doesn't mean they're relevant to current events.



#### **CHECK YOUR BIASES**

Consider if your own beliefs could affect your judgement.



#### Headlines can be outrageous in an effort



#### SUPPORTING SOURCES?

Click on those links. Determine if the info given actually supports the story.



#### If it is too outlandish, it might be satire.

Research the site and author to be sure.



Ask a librarian, or consult a fact-checking site.



#### MISINFORMATION VS DISINFORMATION

- MISinformation: incorrect or misleading information that is described as fact. It's often shared without the person realizing it isn't correct in an attempt to help or feel a part of a community. (Merriam-Webster. (n.d.). First used in 1609)
- DISinformation: <u>false information deliberately and often covertly spread</u> <u>in order to influence public opinion or obscure the truth.</u> Often shared with the intent to sow distrust or for monetary or political gain.(Merriam-Webster. (n.d.). First used in 1939)





- Learn about the algorithms sites use to show you content
- Think carefully about how you're phrasing your searches online
- Think critically about the keywords used online
- Know that media literacy never stop changing, so we have to constantly be willing to learn

- Use the <u>SIFT Method</u> (Caulfield, 2022)
  - S Stop
  - I Investigate the source
  - F Find Better Coverage
  - T Trace claims, quotes, and media to the origin



The **CRAAP** Method (LibGuides, 2021)

- Currency The Timeliness of the info
- Relevance How does the info fit your needs
- Authority The Source of the Info
- Accuracy Reliability or correctness of the info
- Purpose The Reason the info exists

# Image of a purported New York Times headline is fabricated and the article does not exist, fact-checkers say

Fact-checkers from Reuters and AP say an image circulating on social media of a New York Times magazine opinion piece headline regarding teachers tolerating the bullying of unvaccinated children was fabricated and digitally altered. The New York Times confirmed to Reuters and AP that the headline was never published nor written by anyone at the company.
