





Preparing Teens for Mock Interviews

- Teens now had a resume to work from to help prep!
- Told them what time mock interviewers would be arriving.
- Shared the questions that the interviewers were going to ask.
 (2 standard questions & 1 surprise question!)



Preparing Mock Interviewers for Teens

- Shared slide deck for program.
- Highlighted what we would be working on with the teens, including a tasteful way to discuss pay.
- Provided the 2 standard questions and gave them a list of surprise questions they could potentially ask.

What We Learned from Workshop Programs

- Examples that are teen-friendly, but maybe not *too* teen-friendly.
 - Backfired <u>TikTok</u> example :(
- Worksheet worked well! Keep job-seeking accessible to teens.
- Mock Interviews
 - Create a fake job.
 - Make them less scary, but not *too* less scary.
- Change room set-up to help separate mock interviewing space.

- 28 businesses in 2022










Day of the Event


